Roland Water Tower Frequently Asked Questions Updated on 9-14-21

How do I keep informed about what is happening at the RWT?

Who is responsible for the RWT property?

- The RWT and the surrounding property is owned by Baltimore City. Now that construction has completed, management of the property will transition from the Department of Public Works to the Department of General Services.
- The Roland Park Community Foundation is the sponsor of the tower restoration and park design project. They are responsible for contracts for design and construction, financial matters and park maintenance.
- Community input and decision making is done by a steering committee of volunteers from Rolden, Hoes Heights and Roland Park.
- Questions, concerns, and issues should be communicated by email to rolandwatertower@rolandpark.org, which is monitored by the Steering Committee.

What will happen to the falcons residing in the tower?

Peregrine falcons have made the Tower their roosting site for several years. It is an ideal habitat
for them with its sweeping 360 degree views. We consulted with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife
Services about how best to accommodate the falcons so they would return after construction.
Per their advice, a special box was placed in the belvedere of the Tower for their nest. And our
male falcon has indeed been seen and heard starting in September 2021. Hopefully he and a
mate will be nesting in the box this winter.

How can I have input into the park design?

• It has not yet been determined whether the road will reopen, and if so, when. The Steering Committee is continuing to consider input from the affected communities, as well as looking into the City regulatory process. Also, approval by the Maryland Historic Trust is required for any park design.
