Considerations for Road Access

IT WAS NEVER A PUBLIC ROAD

- Road is not now, and never was, a public R.O.W. it is owned and was used by the Department of General Services as a transportation terminus. Redesigning and mapping it as a public road will increase park permitting timeline ... longer time to build the park.
- Road is not part of EMT / Fire route
- Road is not part of any municipal traffic planning

LOCAL TRAFFIC IMPACTS


- Road cut-through improves access to Hoes Heights, but also increases through-traffic in the neighborhood
- Traffic improvements elsewhere in neighborhood are still necessary for safe access to Hoes Heights (i.e. visibility due to street parking at intersections along 41st Street)

PARK USE & SAFETY


- Vehicular speeds and safe park usage (especially for kids) are inherently in conflict
- Peak park time (evenings and weekends) are in conflict with rush hour cut-through traffic
- Safety design features (bollards, curbs, signage, special paving, tabletops) limit park space flexibility and add significant cost
- Evans Chapel intersection is always going to be a safety challenge historic walls were not designed for vehicular use
 - Shared use between pedestrians and cars
 - Poor visibility due to historic walls
 - o Drivers already ignore stop signs along Evans Chapel
- Road cut-through has been previously used for undesirable and illegal activities, i.e. drug dealing









Before it was closed for construction during the Tower stabilization, did you use the roadway?

Survey Write-In Preferences

Minimalist - 16%
Gathering Place - 42%
No Stated Preference - 42%

Major Survey Takeaways & Adjustments

- Concerns about maintenance:
 - Limited non-turf planting areas to two zones adjacent to the Tower
- Clear park boundaries (preferred in "Minimalist"):
 - Included a continuous shrub border at both North and South site edges
- Maintaining (healthy) existing trees:
 - Planned to keep (3) existing Zelkova trees as well as (3) existing trees at the South edge of the site
 - Planned to remove Zelkova with dead wood in interior of park they will be affected by sitework and ADA access grading. Also planned to remove trees at South edge of the site in poor condition
- "Minimalist" clean lines and "Gathering Place" nooks and crannies
 - Keeping mostly the overall form of the "Gathering Place" plan, but have clarified and simplified the curves on the Eastern side of the park
- Site lighting and safety
 - Planned to relocate the (5) existing light poles on site
 - Future phase planned to add new pedestrian light poles throughout the park

Dead Zelkova stump seats or repurposed cable rolls (ask DPW)






6. Temporary lighting or projection on Tower


